"First Edition"

If you've ever shopped at a thrift store or garage sale and were lucky enough to find a first edition book of any renown, you know the joy of discovery. But wherein lies the excitement, in the monetary value of your good fortune (a first edition of <u>Gone With the Wind</u> signed by Margaret Mitchell can bring up to \$27,000)? Or are you joyful to have simply found a good book to read (I discovered Tolkien's <u>Lord of the Rings</u> trilogy in the summer of 1980 having just graduated high school and couldn't put it down)? Presumably, the shopper was in the book section to find something worthwhile to read but scoring a windfall is nothing trifle at either.

What about the Bible? Would it be more exciting if you had one of the 48 remaining Gutenberg Bibles (one sold this month for 5.39 million dollars at Christie's auction house) or simply the one you got at your confirmation? I'd bet the one you received from your church or loved one means a little bit more than money. I sure hope it does, anyway.

The Word of God is a treasure, first edition or otherwise. It is a lamp unto our feet guiding the way to eternal life as it leads us to know God's love and wonderful plan for our salvation. The Word is the primary means of the Holy Spirit to bring saving faith into the hearts of sinners. The Sacraments would be just water, bread, and wine if not for the Word. Thus joined, they carry the power to bestow and sustain faith in Jesus, too. Indeed, Jesus loves me this I know for the Bible tells me so. The Bible, God's Word, is precious.

I think this is a good place to start as we resume our congregational newsletter, a "first edition" of a kind. It's good as Immanuel tries to communicate clearly with its congregational members that we put first things first. So, know that we will continue to emphasize Bible teaching in our worship, study, and our mission under Christ at Immanuel. Scholars don't know when Johannes Gutenberg was born, whether he married or had children. Almost all the information about Gutenberg comes from legal and financial papers, and these indicate that the printing of his Bibles was a particularly tumultuous ordeal. According to one 1455 document, Gutenberg's business partner Johann Fust sued him for the return of a large sum of money loaned to help in the production of his Bibles. Gutenberg lost the lawsuit, and the final ruling stipulated that he had to turn his printing equipment and half the completed Bibles over to Fust, who went on to peddle them along with one of Gutenberg's former assistants, Peter Schoeffer. Gutenberg was driven into financial ruin.

Aside from any loss of revenue, I hope Gutenberg read the pages of his Bible as they were produced. For these were given by God to make us wise unto salvation. You can't put a price tag on such wisdom. As the Word says, "What does it profit a man to gain the whole world but lose his soul?" -Mark 8:38
